Just like cats with diabetes or paraplegia, newborns and orphans are simply too much for many shelters to handle:

- Orphanhood: Mama cats are selfless, but the ravages of outdoor life often separate them from their babies. No one is more alone than an orphaned kitten.
- Enemies: From fleas and ticks to foxes and hawks,

toxes and hawks, kittens are prime prey for nefarious neighbors. With their eyes closed and their soft little bodies unguarded, they are helpless against the animal kingdom.

• Cold: Without

a mother's warmth, a newborn kitten may only survive for a few frightening hours.

- Hunger: Neonatal kittens need to nurse day and night, dependent upon their mothers for basic nourishment as well as colostrum, a source of antibodies. Orphans must be fed an appropriate substitute to survive, but often struggle to accept a bottle, requiring painstaking, 'round-theclock tube-feeding.
- Congenital diseases: The littlest buds may be born with such

problems as umbilical hernias, cardiac abnormalities, or cleft palates. With early intervention, these troubles can be treated.

- Infection: With undeveloped immune systems, kittens are vulnerable to an army of infectious diseases, any of which can be lifethreatening. Caregivers must be vigilant to the first signs of a fading kitten, and ready to provide heroic – and costly – intensive care.
- Fear: Without tender socialization

before the age of around 8 weeks, kittens will struggle to trust humans all their lives. This can put them at risk of euthanasia at shelters that consider them "unadoptable." Teaching a kitten to trust is a labor-intensive odyssey of the heart.

But Tabby's Place is a haven for

the littlest and the lost, which makes kittens the ultimate "Tabby's Place cats."

Our team is skilled in raising newborns, making us a sheltering sky for these little moonbeams. Our foster network provides 24/7 care for the world's most at-risk kittens, giving them the future that every innocent baby deserves. And every spring, more kittens cry out for our help.

• She loves me not: All that cuteness comes with a hearty side of chaos. Kittens are new to this business of being alive, and it's their job to explore everything from gravity to their own strength. Along the way, they will knock over all your knick-knacks and gnaw everything they can fit inside their mouths.

- She loves me: If you'd like more laughter in your life, a kitten is your comedian-in-chief. A wee one will romp and leap with you, chasing the wand toy long after your adult cat has skulked off to sleep.
- She loves me not: Playtime isn't all fun and games, it's an absolute requirement for a healthy

kitten. You must be committed to exercise and enrichment every day...as well as a good deal of education. The annoyances you overlook now (finger biting, destructive behavior, harassing other cats) will grow into pernicious problems as a kitten becomes a cat. You'll also need to baby-proof your house, protecting your kitten from her own curiosity. Raising a kitten requires patience and perseverance.

- She loves me: Your joyful jellybean is just beginning, which means you have so much to look forward to together. In most circumstances, kittens are in the prime of their lives, with many happy years ahead. Especially if your heart has recently been broken by loss, a kitten may be the companion you need.
- She loves me not: You're not the only companion your kitten needs. To bloom into a welladjusted adult, and to avoid long-term aggression issues

that can develop from being an "only kitten," every kitten should have another playful cat in the household.

• She loves me: If you're smitten and committed, a kitten can always be right for you. Educate yourself in her needs, prepare your heart and home, and get ready for the adventure of a lifetime!

# Tiny Cats, Gigantic Grief

Every kitten deserves a sea of springtimes and a life as long as a symphony. But tragedy touches even the tiny.

As a haven for the vulnerable, Tabby's Place faces sorrow too often. How do we handle the canyons of grief?

- We turn to each other: Tabby's Place is a community of love, where staff, volunteers, adopters, and donors treat each other with gentleness and respect. In times of sorrow, it's safe to grieve, knowing we'll find a shelter in each other's care. When your heart is broken, let your dear ones love you.
- We marinate in memories: In the fog of loss, we can despair that we couldn't do more. But this is the time to remind ourselves of

the sweet moments and the tenderness that transcends time. We did our best to fill their days with lifetimes of love, and not even death can end our bond. It can be helpful to share funny memories, knowing every kitten would want us to keep laughing in their honor.

• We write (and more): Grief contained is grief made colossal. Expressing ourselves, whether through written tributes to the cats we've loved; journaling; visual art; or even singing sad songs on the car ride home are all ways of letting love and sorrow knit something healing and new.

• We know when we need help: Sometimes sorrow is just too wearying to "white-knuckle."

Counseling, pet loss support groups, and even medication can help us through a loss we feel we can scarcely survive.

• We love forward: At Tabby's Place, death and life stand shoulder-to-shoulder and whiskerto-whisker. No sooner have we said goodbye to a beloved resident, than another is crying for comfort (or dinner). Loving the cats who still need us is a way of honoring the cats who have taken such good care of us. Indeed, Jonathan founded Tabby's Place as a way of continuing to care for Tabby in the face of each cat we rescue. The best way to keep love alive is by loving.
